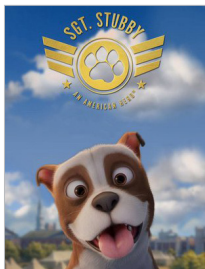


## Sgt Stubby: An American Hero R/C Wilkes Barre Movies 14
